

 - 3. Celebrate the creativity and artistic expression of disabled students at UQ with an emphasis on showcasing art to the rest of the community at UQ and outside of it.
 - 4. Provide workshops and panels that share insights and lived experience with the collective students' and the community.
- 2. Support the welfare and wellbeing of disabled students at UQ:
 - 1. Hold social events that celebrate the community and its members.
 - Maintain a physical space where disabled students can rest, recover, and feel safe and accepted.


Goorie Berrimpa Budget

- To represent the interests of Indigenous students within the UQU and toward the broader UQ community.


